

Autumn Term Curriculum 2016 (Second Half Term)

Year 6

<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> 	<p>Fiction: Story writing We will continue to review punctuation and grammar, whilst learning new terminology. We will be concentrating on developing characters through our writing this half term.</p> <p>Non-fiction: Recounts We will be looking at different types of recounts and then comparing the features of different non-fiction texts. The children will then write recounts from real life experiences.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Mathematics</p> 	<p>We will be revisiting compact methods for addition and subtraction, short and long multiplication and division. We will be using and applying all these methods in different contexts. We will be extending our calculations using fractions and decimals.</p> <p>We will also be working on our resilience and perseverance in solving mathematical problems. We will be increasing our speed, fluency and accuracy with arithmetic style calculations in preparation for the Summer term.</p> <p>We will be continuing to improve our fluency and accuracy with our basic skills including addition and subtraction bonds to 100, speed and accuracy with our times tables to x12 –</p>

	<p>especially x6, x7, x8, x9 including the related division facts. E.g. $7 \times 9 = 63$, $63 \div 9 = 7$, $63 \div 7 = 9$, telling the time to the minute etc. We will also continue our FAST maths times tables challenge, three times a week, working on improving our times tables.</p> <p>Please also see the Year 6 Autumn Term Maths Leaflet for details on the maths curriculum being covered this term.</p>
<p>Connected Curriculum (Topic Theme)</p> 	<p>Has there ever been a better time to live here? We will be learning about the changes in food, fashion, music, travel and technology over time. The children will have the opportunity to research areas of interest to them. They will also choose their favourite decade in preparation for a through the decades taste and fashion day!</p>
<p>Computing</p> 	<p>The children will be conducting a lot of research in this theme finding out about changes in food, fashion, music, travel and technology.</p> <p>We will be continuing to develop our computer programming skills through 2 Code on the Purple Mash website. <p>Music</p> 	<p>We will be following a new Music programme called Charanga Music as our main music lessons this year.</p>

specialist teacher. We will also be moving on to reading and writing basic French.

Additional Information

Regular reading will support your child's reading, comprehension and their writing. Even though your child can read please still encourage them to read regularly and try to hear them read as often as you can. This will enable you to ask them questions about the text, which is as important as being able to read it.

Spellings

Please continue to help your child learn both the Year 3&4 and Year 5&6 spellings. Encourage and support your child in learning to read them, spell them and understand what they mean, including being able to use them correctly in sentences.

Times tables

These are key to all aspects of maths calculating; multiplication, division, fractions and so on. Please encourage your child to learn these off by heart and the related division facts.

SATs Practise Papers

If you want to buy or print off any past papers or use any of the new books which have been released for the new curriculum then please do so. ALL practise will help familiarise your child with test layouts, question style etc. Use any you like, if they do them in school a second time it will still be a huge benefit.
